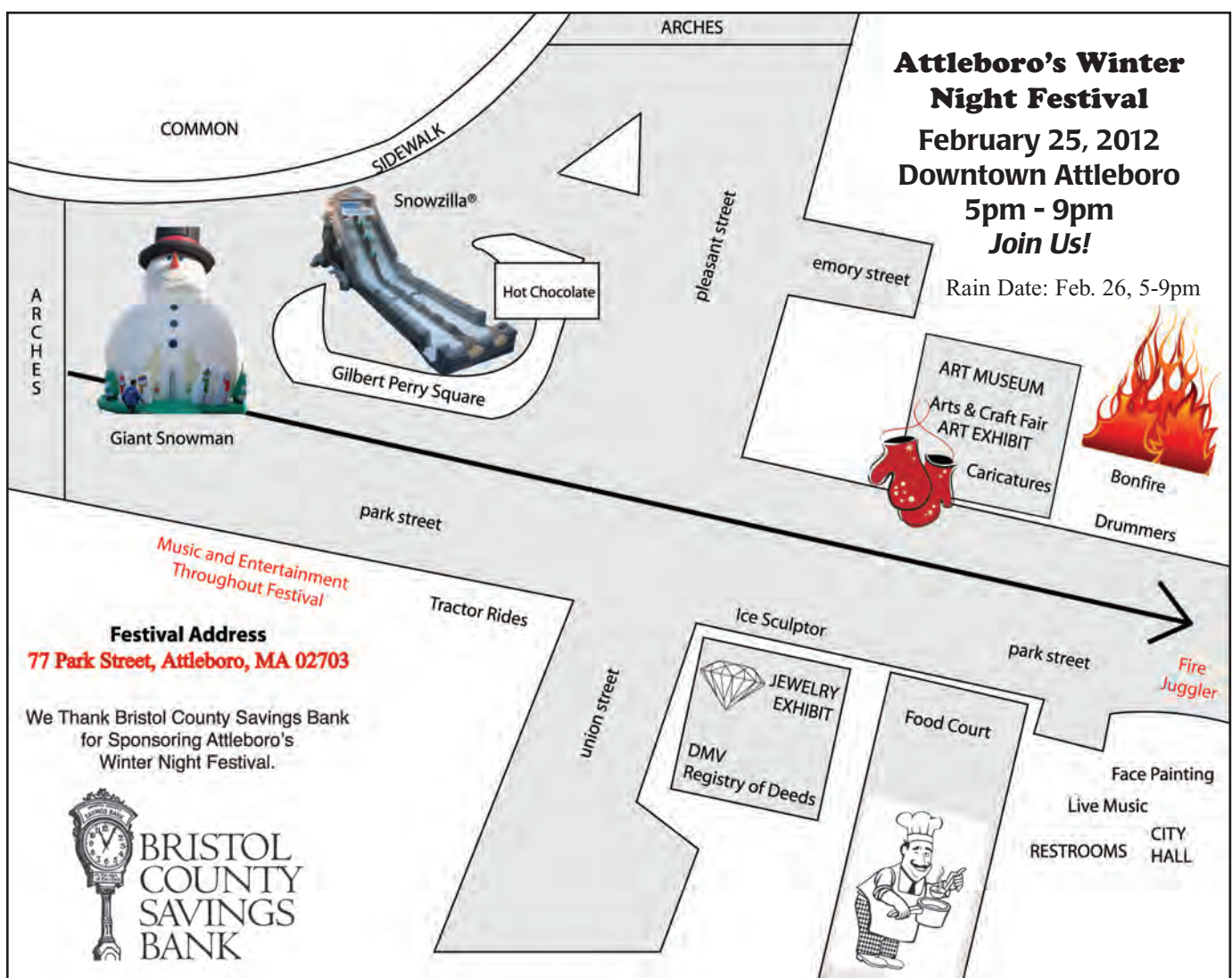

(Free) Giant Snowman- (5-9pm) Gilbert Perry Square. Step inside this giant blow-up snowman and bounce around for awhile!

(Free) Snowzilla® - (5-9pm) Climb 32 feet in the air and slide down this huge 90 foot toboggan run!

(Free Admission) Attleboro Arts Museum's Winter Art & Craft Fair (5-9pm) Attleboro Arts Museum.

Creative handmade items that showcase great local talent. The Museum's Gift Shop will also be open offering artful gifts.
Wonderful shopping – unique items – support the arts!

(Free) Caricatures - (5-9pm) Attleboro Arts Museum. Caricature artist Adam Cristaldi creates keepsake portraits of Winter Night Festival attendees. Stop by for this special memento. *This attraction is first come, first served; caricatures are limited.*
